REGULATION OF INVESTIGATORY POWERS ACT

The Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act requires local authorities to adopt written procedures for the conduct of covert surveillance by their staff and for the use of such surveillance and the procedures governing them to be monitored by elected members.

Carmarthenshire County Council complies with this requirement by means of an annual report to the relevant Executive Board Member.

The last annual report was presented shortly before the local authority elections in May 2017.

Since that report a need has been identified to amend the corporate procedure to include a chapter relating to the acquisition of communications data, so that officers are clear as to the correct process to follow when seeking such information.

To date the authority has not used its powers under the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act to acquire communications data. On the one occasion where an investigating officer sought to do so legal advice was provided that such a step was not necessary to progress the criminal investigation that the officer was engaged in.

Nevertheless, it is considered desirable that the procedure document be amended to include reference to the acquisition of communications data.

An amended version of the procedure document is attached to this report and the Executive Board Member is asked to approve the changes.
