#### Policy, Crime & Disorder and Equalities

Measures to reduce energy consumption and include renewable energy sources for new build projects directly deliver against the goals contained in the Well-being of Future Generations Act 2015, in particular a "Globally responsible Wales", a "Resilient Wales" and a "Healthier Wales".

#### **Finance**

The energy efficiency programme has been funded from the Salix invest-to-save programme and is projected to save over £7million over the lifetime of the installed technologies. Overall cost of energy consumption in non-domestic Council buildings has reduced by 9.2% between 2012/13 and 2016/17.

### **Physical Assets**

All major Council new build projects incorporate renewable energy technologies and are designed to minimise energy use by using a "Fabric First" approach to achieve "Passivhaus" certification.
