On 21st March, the UK Government published a research report - The Impact of Local Authority Trading Standards in Challenging Times (Link to the report - https://www.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment data/file/420218/bis-15-139-the-impact-of-local-authority-trading-standards-in-challenging-times-r2.pdf) The research objectives were to: examine the benefits and efficiency of trading standards activities show how they align with national and local priorities show the impact of cuts to funding over recent years A summary of recommendations in the report were as follows: 1. Painting a clearer picture of the benefits that trading standards work contributes to local and national priorities and its benefits to the public purse. 2. Developing a logic model for trading standards processes. 3. Developing case studies that describe and estimate the benefits of trading standards services. 4. Building an evidence base on the impact of budget cuts to local trading standards services in recent years.
