Project Description	 The Black Mountain Centre is a multi-functional community facility based in the village of Brynaman. It was set up to provide a focal point and venue for a number of community activities and services that support residents of the Upper Amman Valley and surrounding area, thus improving access to services and activities in an inclusive way. The Centre encourages community participation and partnership
	working, also volunteering and learning opportunities in supporting personal development, also providing courses, activities, events and clubs with a focus given to health, recreation and education.

	The Centre is a 'one-stop-shop' for the community and houses the Doctor's surgery, library, police service and the Black Mountain Gallery and the Cafe is also housed within the Centre and provides local residents and visitors with a much needed community cafe and meeting point. They provide a number of Educational opportunities, working in partnership with Swansea University, Aberystwyth University, Coleg Sir Gar and private training companies to hold formal and informal courses and workshops, currently facilitating the following courses; Information Technology for beginners Digital Media Photoshop Web design Maths GCSE, English GCSE, Spanish for beginners, Spanish for beginners and many more. The Centre also provides work experience for people through organisations such as Workways and Coleg Sir Gar, enabling them to develop work-related skills to assist them in securing employment.
	The Centre serves approximately 1500 visitors a week who either use the self-sufficient café or attend various courses, workshops and groups. Due to the age of the building / facilities, it has become apparent that the condition of the Centre is having a detrimental effect on the ability to not only conduct these events safely but also to be of sufficient aesthetic standard to encourage course providers to use our venue over others.
	This Project is to support internal and external refurbishments in order to provide a more convivial and aesthetically pleasing environment for people to enjoy all available facilities, also funding a new and upgraded website.
	The primary beneficiaries of the services available at the Centre are residents of the Upper Amman Valley (UAV). The UAV is a deprived area, with high level of unemployment, benefit dependency and ageing population. The Centre has an open door policy, and encourages people of all ages and abilities, also attracts visitors/tourists and businesses.
