Llanddarog Community Council covers 3 villages to the east of Carmarthen, namely Llanddarog, Porthyrhyd and Mynyddcerrig.

In each of these villages there are community groups which are very active in running local community facilities and with which the Council has a close working relationship.

As these are small, close knit, communities there is an overlap between the membership of the Council and membership of these community groups.

In none of these cases has the Council nominated or appointed any of its members to serve on these community groups as a representative of the Council.

It is not uncommon for Council business to relate to, or be likely to impact, upon these community groups. This might include for example a decision by the Council to hire a facility run by a group in order to hold a Council event, or a request by a group for funding from the Council.

Councillor Evans is a member of the management committee of both Llanddarog Village Hall and Pwyllgor Llesiant Porthyryhd Welfare Committee. As such he has a personal and prejudicial interest in any Council business relating to or likely to affect those organisations. Councillor Evans has no other personal or financial interest in such business.

Llanddarog Village Hall is owned by the community and run as a not for profit registered charity by an elected committee of volunteers. Its purpose is to enhance the quality of life in the village through supporting and providing facilities for community, social, cultural and recreational events.

Pwyllgor Llesiant Porthyryhd Welfare Committee is also a registered charity which owns and operates both the village hall ('Y Neuadd Fach') and the adjoining recreation ground ('Cae Efail'). The former is used by local football teams and local children and the latter hired out for community events, parties etc.
