CARMARTHENSHIRE'S WELSH IN EDUCATION STRATEGIC PLAN (WESP): Update and proposals for implementation (March 2019)

1. BRIEF SUMMARY OF PURPOSE OF REPORT.

The WESP strategy journeyed successfully through the corporate progress in 2017 and received Welsh Government approval in March 2018. The launch event was held on June 25th, 2018. The Autumn Term of 2018 was occupied by further planning, discussions with stakeholders - as a precursor for implementation. Proposals for implementing are now largely ready for corporate perusal.

The reports sets out:

- A brief chronology of recent actions
- Sets out some legislative and procedural considerations
- Detail of Phase 1 (January 2019 onwards)
 - Move to implement all WESP key areas as described by the development plan
 - Implement appropriate quick wins in all schools and settings (no need to consult formally)
 - Instigate formal consultation to change the nature of provision in a number of schools, including those developed via the MEP programme
- Other possible developments which are at concept stage currently and require further scoping
- Detail of **Phase 2** (2020 and implement by September 2021)
- Outline of Phase 3 (2021 and implement by September 2022 onwards)
- Proposals to develop Canolfannau laith / Language Centres
- Next stages and other actions
