

e) Relevant Sections of the Local Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of Carmarthenshire's Licensing Policy are relevant to this licence application:-Section 3 Fundamental principles, Section 4 Conditions of Licence, Sections 5 – 9 relating to The Licensing Objectives and Section 11 relating to Licensing Hours. In particular section 6.12 of the policy which identifies Nott Square as a hot spot of alcohol related crime and disorder.

f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

Having considered the current application and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule is not sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

The Police and Environmental Health have both submitted letters of representation in relation to the application. The Police representation requests that additional conditions be attached to the licence should the application be granted. The Environmental Health representation also outlines licence conditions which they believe are appropriate to attach to the licence if the application is granted.

A further representation has been received from another person, which sets out their objection to the application. The subcommittee will have to be satisfied that granting the application will not undermine the licensing objectives.

Given the proposed hours of operation of the premises, the activities requested and the location of the premises within a hot spot for alcohol related crime and disorder, I believe that if the application is granted it would be appropriate to replace all the statements made in the operating schedule with conditions requested by the Police and the conditions requested by Environmental Health.

These representations have been prepared on the 15th of November following a meeting at the premises on the 14th of November with the applicant and the responsible authorities to discuss the application.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.

Films, Indoor Sporting Events, Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance and Supply of Alcohol- Monday and Tuesday 12:00 – 02:00, Wednesday to Sunday 12:00 to 03:00.

With reference to the above application the Carmarthenshire Division of the Dyfed Powys Police will make the following representations.

There are no Police objections to the application but due to the location of the new premises which is in a 'Hot Spot' for Alcohol related Crime and Disorder as identified in the Carmarthenshire County Council Licensing Policy and together with the nature of the Licensing Activities and hours applied for, the Police have asked for strong and robust conditions to promote the Licensing Objectives.

- 1. The whole of the licensed area with entry and exit areas must be covered by CCTV cameras, and there must not be any hidden or obscured areas. This will deal with Issues which may have arisen outside the premises when customers have been arriving or leaving.
- 2. The System must be installed by a company certified by SSAIB or NSI Gold standard.
- 3. Main entrance exit to have a camera meeting a minimum of 100%R image quality.
- 4. All footage must be of good quality and of a minimum performance capability sufficient to identify individuals.
- 5. It must be in colour.
- 6. It must record at a minimum of 12 images per second.
- 7. All images will be time and date stamped.
- 8. All footage during the hours of Licensable activities to be retained for a period of 30 days.
- 9. The CCTV system must operate continuously, and if a defect arises the police must be informed and immediate arrangements must be made to rectify the fault
- 10. All footage must on demand be made available to a Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer and Local authority Officer for viewing and a copy of that footage made immediately available to the above officers.
- 11. At all times during the period of operation of the premises there must be a competent person on the premises capable of reply and be able to undertake the export of recordings quickly onto a removable storage medium. Memory Stick, CD, or DVD format is acceptable to the police. The master copy will be available to the police on demand.
- 12. The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any Microsoft Windows or MAC compatible computer. The application software required to launch and view recorded images must either be included as part of the standard operating system installed or be installed to the recorded media when the data is copied to that media.
- 13 The system must be registered with the information Commissioner (Tel 0303 123 1113 or email registration@ico.org.uk)

number 01269 590580 as to discuss the above CCTV conditions prior to any agreement being reached. This is to ensure that any system installed complies with the requirements of the proposed licence conditions.

14. Door Supervisors to be on duty from 2200hrs on Friday and Saturday nights until the premises close.

Door Supervisors to be on duty from 22.00hrs on specific days such as Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and Bank Holiday Sundays. Also whenever live major sporting events take place. The use of Door Supervisors to be risk assessed on all other occasions.

When employed Door Supervisors must be registered with the SIA, to be on duty until the time that all members of the public have left the premises.

The Licence Holder shall supply an appropriate number of Door Supervisors for the maximum occupancy figure stated in the licence and the appropriate number shall be 2 in respect of the first 100 persons and one for each additional 100 persons or part of 100 persons comprised in the maximum occupancy figure.

Door Supervisors shall not be permitted to consume intoxicating liquor or other Intoxicants during any period of duty at the Premises. A Door Supervisor shall report on duty in a sober condition.

The Designated Premises Supervisor or Premises Licence Holder shall nominate for each and every exit door a Door Supervisor who's duty it shall be to ensure that the exit door is opened immediately in the event of a Fire or other Emergency and if practicable no more than one door shall be designated to each Door Supervisor.

No Door Supervisors shall be engaged in any duty that would otherwise prevent them from carrying out their duty as a Door Supervisor or exercising general supervision and control of persons attending the Premises.

- 15. No open glass or glass vessels/bottles to be removed from the boundary of the Premises.
- 16. The DPS to become a member of the local Pub Watch scheme and to support the BOBB scheme, 'Behave or be Banned'.

As per paragraph 6.7 within the Licensing Policy

- 17. The challenge 25 scheme to be adopted at the premises with notices and posters to be clearly displayed in the premises, near the entrances and bar areas. This is to emphasise to customers that they will be challenged if they look 25 and under.
- 18. No person under the age of 18 shall be employed on the premises whether paid or unpaid for the purpose of serving alcohol.

- 19. The consumption of alcohol by customers at the premises must cease at or before the end of opening hours as specified in the premises licence. Staff are required to collect all alcoholic drinks prior to the end of the opening hours as set out in the licence.
- 20. The Designated Premises Supervisor or another Personal Licence Holder to be on the premises on Friday and Saturday night's between the hours of 20.00 and 03.30hrs.
- 21. No person under the age of 18 years to enter or remain on the premises after 22:00 with signage to be prominently displayed within the premises.

The above conditions the police believe are necessary and appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

Further to the receipt of the above application and a site visit on the 14th of November 2019, I would like to make the following representations on behalf of the Environmental Health Section of Carmarthenshire County Council.

The premises has not been previously Licensed by the applicant, therefore we do not have a history of "Public Nuisance" or "Public Safety" complaints. Nevertheless I would like to make the following comments that are based upon my professional opinion, experience from dealing with similar venues across the county and also the following factors specifically relating to this application

- The nature of the application including the hours and activities applied for
- The nature of the locality and its proximity to existing residential properties
- The proposed operating schedule does not contain sufficient noise control measures.

In order to ensure that the "Public Safety" Licensing objective is being promoted we request that the following conditions are attached to the Premise Licence.

- 1. The consumption of all drinks at the premises shall be restricted to the Licensable area only.
- 2. No open glass or glass vessels to be removed from the curtilage of the premises.
- 3. The outdoor area located to the front of the premises and highlighted on the attached "Plan 1" is to be designated as the smoking area for the premises and all patrons must use this area for smoking.

The applicant has provided a Noise Impact Assessment (NIA) for the premises which was undertaken by Acoustics Consultants Ltd (Ref No 7808/BL version 4.0) dated the 21/10/19. The NIA report states (point 4.2) that whilst there are no specific noise







limits for amplified music from Licensed Premises. However they state that an Internal limit in dwellings of NR 25 between the hours of 23:00 to 07:00 would provide sufficient protection to any residential properties in the vicinity. In order to achieve this level the report recommends that the applicant undertake specific mitigation work to the fabric of the building and also recommends that the music level inside the premises be set at 95dBA LAEq1hr. Therefore in order to provide clear and enforceable conditions from the information contained within the NIA I recommend that the following conditions are attached the Premises Licence in order to ensure that the "Prevention of a Public Nuisance" Licensing objective is being promoted.

- 4. The development hereby approved shall be implemented strictly in accordance with the recommendations and mitigation measures contained in the Noise Impact Assessment Report undertaken by Acoustic Noise Consultants Ltd (Ref No 7808/BL version 4.0) dated the 21/10/19. The Noise Insulation Measures contained in the Report shall be completed prior to the use of the building and thereafter retained in perpetuity.
- 5. Upon request of the Licensing Authority the applicant must be able to demonstrate that the proposed development complies with the noise limits detailed in the NIA undertaken by Acoustic Noise Consultants Ltd (Ref No 7808/BL version 4.0) dated the 21/10/19. This evidence must be provided for written approval within 28 days of a written request from the Licensing Authority. In the event that the noise limits are not achieved the written submission should also specify further mitigation measures to ensure compliance with the noise limits specified.
- 6. A noise limiting device shall be used in relation to all sound amplification equipment used in conjunction with the Premises Licence.
- 7. The noise limiting device shall be installed and set at a level approved by the Council through its authorised Environmental Health Officer prior to the opening of the premises in conjunction with the premises licence.
- 8. The noise limiting device shall be properly secured so that it cannot be tampered with.
- 9. The noise limiting device shall only be reset with the authority of the Council through an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Section.
- 10. If deemed necessary, the noise limiting device shall be reset to a level approved by the Council through an authorised officer of the Environmental Health Section within 14 days of notification.
- 11. During periods of regulated entertainment all external windows and doors shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress to the premise.

On discussion with the applicant during the site visit on the 14th of November 2019 I understand that he is intending to seek further advice and clarity from his appointed Acoustic Consultants. This may result in a revised NIA being submitted. Should the

revised NIA demonstrate that an internal limit in dwellings of NR 25 can be achieved then I am willing to amend condition 5 and 6 above to reflect the detail contained within the revised NIA.

Should you agree with the above and wish to accept the conditions, you are required to confirm in writing that you do so. A copy of your acceptance should be forwarded to the Licensing Section and myself.

Accepting the above will enable me to withdraw the representation and the above requirements will become conditions of your premises licence.

Carmarthen Town Councillors considered this application yesterday evening and wish to object to the grant of this licence on the grounds of: (a) preventing a public nuisance and (b) public safety.

The premises in question are next door to St Peter's Civic Hall, and Councillors believe that many people are deterred from using the facilities available at the Civic Hall due to the behaviour of the very many people who frequent this part of Carmarthen when under the influence of alcohol. This has a direct impact on the safety and well-being of members of the public, and in particular those members of the community who would otherwise use St Peter's Civic Hall. It is felt that granting this licence next door would have a further detrimental effect upon the use of St Peter's Civic Hall and the well-being of people who frequent

In the event of there being a hearing regarding this application Councillor Peter Hughes Griffiths (cc'd) has indicated his intention to attend to represent the Town Council.

From our previous discussions you will know that the Town Council has no access to any statistical data regarding antisocial behaviour; we have to rely on the information available from the police in this respect via a Freedom of Information request, and this is likely to take considerable time to obtain. It would be very much appreciated If you could advise me regarding any further information that the Town Council will need to include in support of its objection to this application and the best way in which to collate and present such information.

Carmarthen Town Councillors also believe that, in view of the increase in the number of licensed premises in the Nott Square/King Street/Queen Street area, it is now opportune to consider whether the area Should in fact be subject of a cumulative impact policy, similar to Lammas Street.
