

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the retail unit area.

Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner.

c) Public safety

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.

Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements.

Training and implementation of underage ID checks.

A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective.

Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.

The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.

Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.

Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours.

The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to

Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity

e) The protection of children from harm

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Tudalen 19

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
 of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employe...
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.



- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.

I refer to Ace Llanelli Ltd's application for an alcohol licence at the discovery centre cafe, north dock.

I would like to object to this licence being granted.

The North Dock building and cafe area has been an alcohol-free oasis since opening nearly two decades ago. Surely there are enough bars, clubs and pubs in so many areas of Llanelli to satisfy demand for alcohol.

I think it would be a very retrograde step to allow sales of alcohol in this new area of Llanelli, particularly on such all-day hours as it would only encourage drunkenness and rowdy and loud behaviour, and possibly drunk-driving as the cafe is only really accessible by car. The cafe and seafront area are used by families with children and this is no place for drunkenness.

In particular the hours requested in the licence are ridiculous - 9am to 11pm, 7 days a week. How can it possibly be a good idea to serve alcohol starting so early in the morning and going on continually for 14 hours a day, all week? Who needs or wants to start drinking at 9am? Some reasonable lunch time and evening licence hours might be more appropriate, and only serving alcohol with bona-fide meals, rather than the cafe becoming just another bar or club as so many have in Llanelli.

I urge the officers and members of the Council to reject this application, or at least severely limit the hours during which alcohol can be served.

Please would you acknowledge receipt of this objection.

Dear Mr Powles

Thank you for taking the time to write this email from which I can gather you interest in the local community and the wellbeing of it.

We have the same interest at heart as happy customers are good for us and the local area. Our plans are to invest a large amount of money in improving the local offering. As you are well aware at this moment in time the Discovery Centre offers at the ground floor an ice cream parlour, an empty area where the information centre used to be and public toilets which are not in an ideal state of repair. Upstairs, on the first floor there is a basic coffee shop similar in aspect to a canteen with the second floor housing offices which have been vacated. I believe that it can hardly be considered a great offering for the local area.

The general opinion of people that we discussed with and indeed staff working at Discovery centre is that the footfalls throughout the year is so erratic and unreliable and low that the sustainably of the building is at risk, consequently risking future closure or considerable reductions of even the present facilities.

Currently we are running a business in Langland Bay by the name of Langland Brasserie and we intend to have a similar venture in Llanelli.

At Langland's brasserie, alcohol is served from opening until closing in the evening. This has not affected the rate at which families visit the restaurant and has not changed how we cater to our customers who do not wish to drink alcohol. However we believe that the availability for alcohol to be served allows for appealing propositions such as champagne breakfasts which are loved by the community as well as meet and greet's with champagne or buck fizz for a small weeding or gathering. That I believe will not lead to drunken and disorderly behaviour or drink driving or loud arguments. Langland brasserie is also secluded and in a hearing distance of local residents yet the serenity of the locale has not be in any way harmed by the serving of alcohol due to responsible community members and strict standards regarding serving customers who are overly intoxicated or causing a disruption. In fact the bad behaviour of some members of the public that were using the car park adjacent to the restaurant for doughnuts with the cars or some other less palatable activities has stopped, or has been reduced greatly. We have been trading in Mumbles for the last 9 years and we never had any complaints, in fact most of the residents are happy to have us there and they became our regulars.

We are committed to providing a safe, authentic dining experience for all our customers and firmly believe that providing the opportunity for alcoholic beverages does not change our ethic. We feel a bit hurt about the fact that you imply our purpose is to encourage drunk behaviour and the fact that you opposed the application will delay the plans by at least 3 weeks if not more. We are trying to keep to a very tight schedule and the delay would reduce the viability of the project drastically due to the time dependent nature of our funding. As a consequence we may not be able to continue the venture should we not open by April.

I hope that you are indeed interested in the wellbeing and opportunities of the local community and the progress of such a lovely and special part of Wales that you might find that increasing the offering will make life a bit more interesting and will also attract more tourists in the area that will probably not visit due to lack of facilities.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
 of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.







Queen Victoria Road and Murray Street at the town centre end, to where Station Road ends at the Railway Station gates.

The policy was adopted as a result of a request by the police as part of the review of the Licensing Policy in 2010. It was identified that Station Road had a significantly high number of alcohol related crimes and alcohol related anti-social behaviour incidents during the period 2008 to 2010.

The area had previously been identified in 2007 during the then review of the Licensing Policy as a Crime and Disorder 'Hot Spot' due to the number of alcohol related crime and disorder incidents.

A Designated Public Place Order is now in place and covers an area which includes Station Road; this order seeks to prevent the consumption of alcohol in a public place.

If the committee were to go against its own policy on Cumulative Impact the Police would ask that the following conditions be placed on the Premises Licence.

The Carmarthenshire Division of the Dyfed Powys Police will seek that the following conditions be imposed on the Premises licence if the Licensing Panel grants the application.

- The CCTV system at the premises must be installed by a company certified by SSAIB or NSI Gold standard.
- The whole of the licensed area with entry and exit areas must be covered by cameras, and there must not be any hidden or obscured areas. This will deal with issues which may have arisen outside the premises when customers have been arriving or leaving.
- 3. Main entrance / exit to have a camera meeting a minimum of 100%R image quality.
- 4. All footage must be of good quality and of a minimum performance capability sufficient to identify individuals.
- 5. It must be in colour.
- 6. It must record at a minimum of 12 images per second.
- 7. All images will be time and date stamped.
- 8. All footage during the hours of Licensable activities to be retained for a period of 30 days.
- 9. The CCTV system must operate continuously, and if a defect arises the police must be informed and immediate arrangements must be made to rectify the fault.

- 10. All footage must <u>on demand</u> be made available to a police officer or PCSO for viewing and a copy of that footage made immediately available to a Police Officer or PCSO.
- 11. At all times during the period of operation of the premises there must be a competent person on the premises able to undertake the export of recordings quickly onto a removable storage medium. Memory Stick, CD, or DVD format is acceptable to the police. The master copy will be available to the police on demand.
- 12. The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard-drive to a format that can be played back on any Microsoft Windows or MAC compatible computer. The application software required to launch and view recorded images must either be included as part of the standard operating system installed or be installed to the recorded media when the data is copied to that media.
- 13. The system must be registered with the Information Commissioner (Tel 0303 123 1113 or email registration@ico.org.uk)

To ensure that any system installed complies with the requirements of the proposed licence conditions.

- 14. The challenge 25 scheme to be adopted at the premises with notices and posters to be clearly displayed in the premises, To emphasise to customers that they will be Challenged if they look 25 and under.
- 15. No person under the age of 18 shall be employed on the premises whether paid or unpaid for the purpose of serving alcohol.

Evidence in relation to alcohol related crime and disorder in Station Road will be provided by means of a witness statement.

The above conditions the police believe are necessary and appropriate to promote the Licensing Objectives.

e) Relevant Sections of the Local Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority believes that the following sections of Carmarthenshire's Licensing Policy are relevant to this licence application:-Section 3 Fundamental principles, Section 4 Conditions of Licence, Sections 5 – 9 relating to The Licensing Objectives and Section 10 relating to Cumulative Impact.

Cumulative Impact

The cumulative impact policy was first adopted by the authority in March 2012. In 2016 as part of a review of the Licensing Policy, the Cumulative Impact Policy was reviewed and is set out on pages 19 - 21 of the Licensing Policy document dated February 2016. The evidence supporting the continued adoption of the policy is summarised in paragraphs 1 – 7 on pages 20 and 21 of the Policy document.

The policy creates a presumption that the authority will refuse an application for the grant of a licence in the area defined in paragraph 10.1 of the policy (see below).

The policy does not override the fundamental principle of the Licensing Act, that the Licensing Authority's discretion is only engaged where representations are made, this is set out in paragraph 3.1 on page 5 of the Licensing Policy. Since the Policy document was reviewed in 2016, the Home Office guidance has been amended at paragraph 14.27 to reflect that Cumulative Impact Assessments, as they are now known, may relate to premises licensed for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

The Licensing Policy document clearly indicates which types of licensed premises are subject to the Policy at paragraph 10.2 which is set out below:

10.1 The Licensing Authority has received sufficient evidence to show that a Cumulative Impact Policy continues to be required in relation to the lower end of Station Road ,Llanelli, between its junction with Queen Victoria Road south to the railway crossing as shown on the plan attached at appendix F. However, in accordance with paragraph 1.7 this matter will be kept under constant review.

This Policy applies to any property which has a boundary on the relevant portion of Station Road.

- 10.2 Where relevant representations are received, it is the Licensing Authority's policy to refuse applications in respect of the lower end of Station Road, Llanelli, between its junction with Queen Victoria Road south to the railway crossing as shown on the plan attached at appendix F for;
 - (a) New Premises Licences

(b) The variation of such licences that are considered likely to add to the existing cumulative impact.

The policy is intended to be strictly applied and will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional circumstances

Exceptions are unlikely to be made on the grounds that the premises are, or will be, well managed

Exceptions should be directed at the reasons underlying the policy.

An exception might arise where an application proposes;

- (a) To effect a real reduction in capacity
- (b) To replace vertical drinking with seated consumption and waiter service.
- (c) To transfer an operation from one premises to another, where the size and location of the second premises is likely to cause less detrimental Impact and will promote the licensing objectives.
- (d) The substitution of existing licensable activity at a premises with licensable activities which would have less impact on the area and would be more likely to further the licensing objectives.

Variation applications which are likely to be considered to add to the existing cumulative impact include;

- (a) An increase in the capacity of the premises
- (b) An extension in the hours of operation of the premises
- (c) Introducing opportunities to consume alcohol other than ancillary to table meals
- (d) Introducing opportunities to take food away from the premises
- (e) Introducing dance floors or similar facilities
- (f) Any other change to the way the premises operate which is likely to have
 - (g) The varying of an existing licence condition attached to a premises licence, which is likely to have an impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The Licensing Authority acknowledges that it has departed from the Secretary of State's guidance by including premises which sell alcohol for consumption off the premises within the scope of this policy. However the Licensing Authority believes that this departure is justified due to the evidence of price competitive behaviour linked to street drinking, underage drinking, proxy sales and pre-loading associated with the concentration of such premises in Station Road, Llanelli.

The Licensing Authority acknowledges that this policy goes further than that set out within the Secretary of State's Guidance. However the Licensing Authority believes this is justified on the grounds set out below.

f) Proposed Operating Schedule.

Having considered the current application and the operating schedule put forward by the applicant, the Licensing Authority believes that, if the application were granted, the wording set out in the operating schedule, is not sufficiently precise to enable it to form clear enforceable licence conditions in accordance with section 18(2)(a) of the Licensing Act.

In our view, should the application be granted, it would be appropriate to replace all the statements made in the operating schedule with the conditions numbered 1-15 put forward by the Police in their letter of representation dated the 4^{th} of December 2018.

However the Licensing Authority notes that the Police have submitted an objection to the grant of the application. The authority believes that the Police representations along with the Cumulative Impact Policy with its supporting evidence raises serious questions as to whether it would be appropriate to grant the application.

These representations have been prepared on the 20th of December 2018 with the benefit of viewing the original application and representations from the Dyfed Powys Police.

I would be grateful if the applicant could contact me to discuss the above representations at the earliest opportunity and certainly prior to the application being referred to a Licensing Sub Committee hearing for determination.
