EXECUTIVE SUMMARY CABINET MEMBER DECISIONS MEETING FOR THE LEADER 26th January 2022

Household Support Fund - Food Poverty WLGA Grant

As part of the Tackling Food Poverty, Carmarthenshire County Council has been allocated an additional budget for financial year 21/22 of £27,865 of revenue funding by the WLGA to help tackle food poverty within the county.

The Purpose of the Fund is to support an increased number of people facing food poverty through the provision of funding to a range of community food initiatives which are experiencing difficulties in meeting the needs of their customers. Such problems might arise from an unsustainable growth in demand for food and essential goods, or difficulties sourcing sufficient donations and good food surplus to meet local needs.

It is proposed that this funding is distributed to local food banks that are helping to tackle food poverty within the county. In order to identify demand, the authority will invite expression of interests from local food banks, up to a maximum of £3,500 to provide support with the purchase of additional supplies of good quality food and essential goods through the Council's existing contract with Castell Howell Foods.

All expression of interests submitted for the fund must support the aim of tackling food poverty and food insecurity. The project must benefit the residents of the Carmarthenshire and meet one or more of the Well-being Objectives within Carmarthenshire County Council's own measurements.

The project will be administered by CCC central Bureau team via an Expression of Interest. Assessment will be on the need for the activity, how they plan to target the most in need, and can be delivered and fully claimed by the 31st March 2022.

Eligible applications will be presented to a grants panel that will be assessed against the criteria and make recommendations for funding.

While these surveys and plans are ongoing, the group will continue to offer Ty Capel vestry as a small meeting venue for community groups to meet while adhering to Welsh Government COVID-19 guidelines about social distancing, ventilation, and hand sanitising. For example, the Community Council have held meetings there, the Parents & Toddlers group are about to start meeting, and local farms have donated firewood totes to raise funds for the community centre project. By the end of the Project Development stage, they expect to be ready to apply for a major grant(s) to progress to the Project Delivery/Capital Works phase of refurbishing and adapting Capel y Groes into a fully accessible, energyefficient, and sustainable community centre. At this stage the broad estimate for capital works is around £250k. They will not stop as one of the key objectives of Menter Cilycwm is "To secure the establishment of a community centre". A Cilycwm community hub will benefit all residents of Cilycwm Community Council area and those of Rhandirmwyn ward in Llanfair-ar-y-Bryn (in total about 600 people from about 250 children including over 80 children/young people). They will benefit from a broad programme of activities based at the centre and other outdoor activities beyond. Evidence of Need / Community Engagement

There is strong evidence of the need for a community centre, they conducted a Project Viability Study in 2019 which proposed three options for future use of Capel y Groes, and the community voted for a community hub.

Before this they carried out several community consultations to find out what people want, a public meeting to discuss whether to accept Capel y Groes as a hall in Feb 2016; a public meeting to discuss the Project Viability study in May 2019; and a tent at 2019 Cilycwm Show asking, "What would improve the quality of life in Cilycwm?"

During the Project Development phase, they expect to hold several more community engagement sessions including inviting people to comment on architect's plans and displays and to contribute to heritage stories

Contributing to key Strategies

The project will address the following outcome of **Carmarthenshire County Council's 2018-2023 Corporate Strategy:**

- Supporting good connections with friends, family, and safer communities (especially helping by people to feel they belong to their local area; encouraging them to treat each other with respect and providing an enabling environment for people in the area from different backgrounds get on well together, as well as advice sessions on home and community safety).
- Recognising that Carmarthenshire has the highest number of Welsh speakers in Wales, promoting Welsh language and culture (especially through use of Welsh language in the community, Cor Cyswllt Cilycwm and more cultural activities in Welsh, and celebrating Welsh history and culture).
- Helping every child to have a good start in life (especially through the Parent & Toddler group).
- Supporting older people to maintain dignity and independence in their later years (especially through Bore Coffi, art & craft classes, skill sharing, advice sessions).

The project will particularly address these two goals of the 2015 **Wales Wellbeing of Future Generations Act:**

- A Wales of more cohesive communities
- A Wales of vibrant culture and thriving Welsh language.

It will also contribute to a healthier Wales, a more equal Wales, a resilient Wales.

They are also in tune with the ways of working promoted by the Act such as: aiming to make Cilycwm a better place to live for now and for people in future; taking a collaborative approach; and considering and involving people of all ages and diversity. As stated above (at §5.0), while Menter Cilycwm's priority is to establish a community centre, in the longer term we intend to inspire the community to do more things together: to re-engage with the wider world of art, music, sport, the natural world and further education.

The Business Plan to be developed during this Project Development phase will fully explore the potential for growth and consider different ways of earning income besides room hire and community fundraising.

Many local people will benefit economically. During the Project Development phase various professionals such as architects, surveyors, engineers, heritage consultants will earn fees. Hiraeth Architecture are based in Cardiff, the Project Development Coordinator is from Cilycwm, others are from around Wales. Menter Cilycwm became responsible for maintenance of Capel y Groes and the adjoining Ty Capel when ownership of the building was transferred to them in May 2019. A key component of this Project Development phase is developing a robust Business Plan with detailed projected financial costs per annum. Current costs are only £700 p.a. but, having consulted other village halls nearby, we estimate that future maintenance costs could be between £2k and £5k p.a.
