Applicant	Ty Golau – House of Light	
Project Description	Ty Golau is a health and wellbeing facility for people aged 50+ who have memory problems/dementia type illnesses within the Llanelli area, holding weekly sessions in both Kidwelly and Llanelli and it is recognised that this facility is the only service of its kind in the County and is of benefit to the people who need the service as well as their families and carers.	
	Activities are organised to provide cognitive stimulation and enjoyment for those who attend and the sessions are facilitated by an Occupational Therapist with a team of volunteers who are undertaking the necessary training in the field of dementia care, learning new skills and gaining experience.	
	Special events are organised to celebrate specific dates during the year, special resources are hired in order to enhance memories of the past and to engage all the senses, also power point presentations are used to reinforce the spoken word. Other activities include crafts, music and movement, reminiscence, indoor gardening, simple cooking and singing.	
	Life story work is also a large part of the service offered, which involves working with the service user on a one to one basis, discussing the history of the person involved and the production of a life story book and life story board of photographs of the person's life. Family members and carers are involved in this service and these resources have proved to be very effective when a person has had to move into a care home, as they can take their life stories with them to be used as a reminiscence tool and staff in the homes then has a resource they can use with the resident.	
	Ty Golau are receiving formal referrals from the Local Health Board, Alzheimer's Society, Crossroads and Memory Clinic, and have received excellent and very positive feedback from the County Council owned care homes who have attended some of the sessions.	
	Reflective practice is ongoing and they are constantly striving to update and improve the quality of service they deliver and this project is to assist with revenue costs in delivering the sessions.
