LOCAL AUTHORITY RESIDENTIAL CARE STANDARD CHARGE FOR 2020-2021

There are currently 7 homes with 248 beds in Carmarthenshire's own residential homes. The overall budgeted costs for running the Authority's residential homes together with the number of beds available and the occupancy levels are the determining factors in calculating the annual Standard Charge.

For 2020-21 there has been no change in the number of Local Authority beds. Staffing costs have increased as a result of the implementation of the National Living Wage which has had a significant impact on the staff in this sector. The National living wage has increased 6.2% on its own, not all this is a direct cost as we pay in excess to the NLW, but the decision on NLW has pushed up staffing costs. There have also been additional costs based on hours and dependency within the settings, in addition to extra costs within supplies and services. As a result, the charge for mainstream beds will increase by 4.74% and EMI beds by 3.1%.

Recommendation

The Standard Charge for Local Authority Older People residential care homes be increased from £612.21 to £641.21 for Mainstream beds and from £837.50 to £863.43 for EMI beds.
