#### LOCAL AUTHORITY RESIDENTIAL CARE STANDARD CHARGE FOR 2021-2022

There are currently 7 homes with a total of 248 beds in Carmarthenshire County Council's own residential homes. The overall budgeted costs for running the Authority's residential homes together with the number of beds available and the occupancy levels are the determining factors in calculating the annual Standard Charge.

In previous years, the calculation for the Standard Charge was actioned later in the year to wait for confirmation of the pay award. As the pay award confirmation was very late in 2020-2021 and looks likely to be post-April in 2021-2022, the calculation is using the Revenue Budget Strategy projection of 2.5%.

For 2021-22 there has been no change in the number of Local Authority beds. Staffing costs have increased due to an estimated pay award of 2.5% in line with the Council's Revenue Budget Strategy and extra costs pressures on supplies and services of 2%. There are no proposed savings efficiencies reducing the budgets.

As a result, the charge for mainstream beds will increase by 2.00% and EMI beds by 2.40%.

#### Recommendation

The Standard Charge for Local Authority Older People residential care homes be increased from £641.21 to £654.06 for Mainstream beds and from £863.43 to £884.17 for EMI beds.
