Task & Finish Objective(s)	To review the current internal processes and operational issues of fly tipping on public and private land in Carmarthenshire.
Context	The Environmental & Public Protection Scrutiny Committee has a key role to play in monitoring services, development of key policies and strategies, as well as identifying areas for improvement or development within their remit.
	Fly tipping is an increasing problem in Carmarthenshire. The consequence of fly tipping has a detrimental effect on the environment and communities.
	Fly tipping issues have major impacts on resources in various departments within the Council from Environmental Health and Planning through to Members and Democratic Services.
	Remediation is costly, sometimes difficult and has implications of criminal activity.
	The Environmental & Public Protection Scrutiny Committee agreed to undertake a review into the current internal processes and operational issues of fly tipping on public and private land in Carmarthenshire
	 It is recognised that there is a lack of clarity on roles and responsibilities of various teams within Carmarthenshire and Natural Resources Wales and implications of duplication resulting in a lack of efficient use of resources.
	 It is recognised that the authority are utilising resources on responding to complaints and that there is a lack of resources within the Authority to carry out investigations (which can be complex and time consuming requiring specific skills) in order to prevent issues from occurring.
