## GORCHYMYN GWARCHOD MANNAU CYHOEDDUS – YMGYSYLLTU CYCHWYNNOL Â RHANDEILIAID

Cymeradwyaeth i arolygu/ymgysylltu â rhanddeiliaid perthnasol i gasglu gwybodaeth wrth baratoi ar gyfer adnewyddu ein Gorchymyn Gwarchod Mannau Cyhoeddus

### Yr argymhellion / penderfyniadau allweddol sydd eu hangen:

Cymeradwyo arolwg snap i rhanddeiliaid perthnasol sef Cyngorau Tref a Chymuned a Chymdeithasau Chwaraeon i gael gwybod pa amodau ychwanegol yr hoffent eu hychwanegu at y 3 amod presennol sy'n ymwneud â gorchmynion cŵn.

### Y Rhesymau:

Mae'r Llywodraeth wedi gwneud darpariaethau i gyflwyno Gorchmynion Gwarchod Mannau Cyhoeddus ac ym mis Gorffennaf 2019, mabwysiadodd yr awdurdod 3 amod yn ymwneud â gorchmynion cŵn sef:

1. Caniatáu i gi faeddu ond nid yw'r perchennog yn codi'r baw ci, mae hyn yn berthnasol i unrhyw fan yn Sir Gaerfyrddin lle mae'r cyhoedd yn cael mynediad ar ôl gwneud taliad neu fel arall.
2. Mae'n rhaid rhoi cŵn ar dennyn yn unol â chyfarwyddyd swyddog awdurdodedig.
3. Ni chaniateir cŵn mewn manau chwarae caeedig i blant.

Caiff y gorchmynion eu hadolygu bob 3 blynedd ac fel rhan o'r broses honno, roedd angen cynnal ymarfer ymgysylltu i gasglu unrhyw amodau ychwanegol i'r 3 uchod gan y rhanddeiliaid perthnasol.

Mae'n bwysig pwysleisio, yn dilyn arweiniad y Swyddfa Gartref, bod yn rhaid dangos tystiolaeth am unrhyw geisiadau am amodau ychwanegol gan y rhanddeiliaid ac os profir hynny, byddai'n destun ymgynghoriad cyhoeddus.

Dylid nodi y bydd proses ymgysylltu ffurfiol sy'n gysylltiedig â'r GGMC yn cael ei chynnal pan wneir y gorchmynion drafft. **PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER RENEWAL –  
INITIAL STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT**

Public Space Protection Orders were introduced to replace the Dog Fouling of Lands Act which was the primary legislation used by Enforcement Officers to control dog fouling in the county. The legislation was restricted only to designated land and fell short of the expectations placed on Enforcement Officers to fulfil their role.

With the introduction of Public Space Protection Orders, Officers were now able to deal with dog fouling offences across Carmarthenshire anywhere the public had access on payment or otherwise. It also enabled officers to deal with dogs off leads and excluding dogs from enclosed play areas.

Any offences committed could be dealt with by either the issuing of a fixed penalty ticket or process via summons to the Magistrates Court. Recently, the authority undertook an asset transfer exercise where recreational land was transferred to Town and Community Councils or Sports Associations.

Early engagement with those stakeholders via a snap survey would be an ideal opportunity to establish what additional conditions may be necessary to fulfil any issues they may have.

The information received will then be used to formulate reports to the Corporate Management Team and Preliminary Cabinet prior to formal consultation as part of the process of making the order. Following that process the orders will then be formulated and reviewed in another 3 years.
