We would like to resurrect 6 previous plots and resize this area into a minimum of 14 new manageable plots. Funding would pay for materials for plot boundaries, new sheds, adopting the current sheds, pathways, composting bins, raised beds and soil, site management tutorials, instruction materials, tools, wheelbarrows, water butts, wildflower areas, bug hotel materials and the like, interpretation boards, compost, mulch, site management advice and marketing costs.
