Community Scrutiny Committee Task & Finish review of Empty Properties in Carmarthenshire

Action Plan Monitoring

Review Background

There are approximately 25,000 empty properties in Wales (WG - 2013/14). There are over 78,000 private sector homes in Carmarthenshire, 9,000 of which are privately rented. As at 1st April 2014 2,479 private sector properties have been empty for 6 months or more. The demand for affordable housing in Carmarthenshire continues to increase while supply is falling at a rate that means we can no longer meet housing needs effectively.

At its Forward Work Programme Planning Session in April 2014, Committee members suggested reviewing empty properties across the county in light of housing need and the high volume of empty properties. At its meeting on the 1st August 2014, the Committee agreed to establish a task and finish group to undertake this review.

Approach

A total of 7 meetings were held between November 2014 and June 2015, which were used to consider evidence and information from a wide variety of sources. The Group also undertook a series of site visits to view a selection of empty properties within the county. The main aims of the review were to:

- To identify and evaluate the current activities undertaken by the Housing & Public Protection Division.
- To identify potential improvements and alternative delivery models.
- To identify cost effective best practice by other authorities, agencies and providers.
- To formulate recommendations for consideration by the Executive Board.

Final Report and Recommendations

The Community Scrutiny Committee received and endorsed the Group's final report and the recommendations at its meeting on the 22nd June 2015.

The report was duly endorsed by the Executive Board at its meeting on the 27th July 2015.

Following every task and finish review, an action plan is developed in order to assist members of the relevant scrutiny committee in monitoring progress in relation to the implementation of the recommendations.

The attached action plan has been completed by the relevant officers in order to provide an update on progress to date in relation to this review.

1. Policy Crime & Disorder and Equalities

Tackling private sector empty homes is an important part of our approach to creating more affordable homes. Our Affordable Homes Action Plan has set a target of turning 280 empty private sector homes into affordable homes to rent.

3. Finance

As part of the Affordable Homes Action Plan £3,675,000 HRA capital has been allocated to support bringing empty back into use.

The Council will enter into long term lease arrangements with empty home owners and manage properties as we would our own stock. The aim is that capital monies we outlay is recovered through income from the rent.

As part of our existing approach we have accessed £1,600,000 Welsh Government funding which is administered in accordance with their Houses to Homes loan scheme.

6. Staffing Implications

A new Empty Homes Advisors post has been agreed and advertised to deal with the additional work relating to increasing the supply of affordable homes.

- **1. Local Member(s)** All elected members were consulted during the review and asked to complete a short questionnaire. In all, 46 members (62%) responded.
- **2. Community / Town Council –** All Town & Community Councils were also consulted as part of the review and sent a short questionnaire. In all, 29 councils (40%) responded.
- **3. Relevant Partners –** Owners of empty properties in the areas of Carmarthen and Llanelli were consulted with during the review. 139 owners responded. Ongoing analysis of the results will inform the revision of the Empty Properties Action Plan.

The public consultation for the development of an Affordable Housing Plan gathered views about bringing empty properties back into use. In all, 781 responses were received and 84% thought bringing empty properties back into use was the best way to increase the number of affordable housing.

4. Staff Side Representatives and other Organisations – Officers from the Housing & Public Protection, Economic Development, Administration & Law, Financial Services and Planning Divisions attended Task & Finish Group meetings to give evidence. A housing consultant also attended a Group meeting to discuss best practice in relation to empty properties.
